# THE GOULBURN WORKERS CLUB ANNUAL ART PRIZE

Our art society's main activity for the year is our annual art prize, named after our main sponsor and the venue in which we hold it.

After cancelling it for 2 years due to Covid we worried about the effects of those cancellations would be on the 2022 exhibition. While numbers of both entrants and entries were down to some degree, we still had 210 entries from 48 artists and photographers resulting in an excellent exhibition of which we felt justifiably proud.

The entries were of a high standard so the judge, Chan Dissanayake had a difficult task to select the prize winners from the 203 art works, while Peter Sykes had less to choose from in his judging of the Photography and Digital Art section. We greatly appreciate the time and effort the judges gave for us. Attendance at the official opening was another most pleasant surprise to us as there were up to 100 people in attendance despite our advertising being a little light on this year. Among these were numerous entrants, art society members, sponsors and four Goulburn Mulwaree councillors.

Vice President, Alex Mortensen, was MC for the opening in lieu of our president, Helen De Jonge, who was still recovering from a serious operation. Tony Dawson, President of Goulburn Workers Club, officially opened the exhibition and the Deputy Mayor of Goulburn Mulwaree Council, Cr Steve Ruddell, was also invited to speak. As the Crescent School was the recipient of our raffle proceeds its principal, Steve Edmonds, told the gathering a little about the school.

GDAS Secretary, Lesley Whitten, presented the prizes.

It was a most enjoyable evening and there were people still wandering around looking at the exhibition until about 9pm. Many more passed through the doors during the 3 days of it running. Congratulations to all the prize winners and to the entrants who sold works at the exhibition.



# LIST OF MATERIALS

Paper: drawing paper 120-150gsm, white, A4 or A3 size, 4 sheets; could be in standard art diary. Please have extra sheets of both kinds of paper in case something goes really wrong.

Drawing media: regular drawing graphite pencils HB, B, 2B, 6B and softer; willow charcoal sticks;



Erasers: kneaded eraser, good quality regular eraser with sharp edge, cosmetick spunge (drop shape), tortillons (stumps), piece of spunge.

Brushes: old bristle brush, size 10; old nylon brush, size 4.

Other materials: craft knife; paper towel; masking tape; board (if not using diary) to support paper. Photos to draw can be supplied or bring your own (on paper - size not smaller than 10x15cm or iPad).


The Ginninderry Drawing Prize is an Australia-wide, non-aquisitive competition for drawings of any subject. This is an open exhibition.
