While the number of entries were down from our peak, we had 223 entries of good quality works which still makes it a large exhibition. Very importantly, it was a well presented exhibition attracting numerous visitors and resulted in 14 sales. A new section, not included in the judging, was the display of works from students of the Crescent School. It was considered to be a very worthwhile addition. All the students were awarded with a participation certificate of which they would be proud.

It has been reported to the editor that the Opening Night was well attended and enjoyed by all. As Tony Dawson, President of Goulburn Workers Club, was unable to attend, the exhibition was officially opened by GWC General Manager, Brett Gorman. Helen De Jonge, in her address, thanked the entrants, the judges, the sponsors and all those who helped to make the exhibition possible. Helen also spoke about the Crescent School, the recipient of our raffle proceeds. One of our judges, Anthea De Silva, presented the prizes but the other judge, Kerry McInnes, was unable to attend.

Without our many sponsors, our Annual Art Prize exhibition would not go ahead. In particular we must mention the role of the Goulburn Workers Club as the auditorium is made available to us from the Tuesday evening prior to the exhibition right through to the end of it. Throughout the year the GWC provides finance, printing support and a meeting room if we require it. Goulburn Mulwaree Council is the other major sponsor with a substantial grant each year for the exhibition. Various other businesses and individual people have also sponsored us with money gifts to assist with prize moneys. Our appreciation is extended to all of you.

MATERIALS LIST FOR WORKSHOP WITH EV HALES

■ RESOURCES

Photographs of landscapes trees and skies – preferably your own images. Be selective no less than 6, no more than 12.

■ BRUSHES

Whatever you usually use, bring your favourite brushes include a variety of shape - square, pointed, long rigger or needle point squirrel and variety of hair type - taklon and hair.

- Include a Square hake or taklon brush 1" or larger.
- Small pointed brush for accents and long rigger.
- A square taklon (white hair fairly stiff is handy for lifting).

■ PAPER

Include both textured and smooth surfaces as the effects are different.

Also bring some pieces of scrap paper.

■ PAINT

I do not mind what colours people bring - part of what I do will show the differences and then it is up to the individuals to select, with understanding, what they want to use.

I use **W&N** Aureolin, Raw Sienna, Burnt Sienna, Cobalt Turquoise, Cerulean, Cobalt and Ultramarine Blues.

Holbein (HWC) Rose Madder, do not purchase W&N Rose Madder.

■ PALETTE

One with about 6 good wells to mix decent puddles.

■ Graphite pencil 3B

■ Masking Tape and rags

■ SUPPORT BOARD

Old office calendars are perfect but light weight rigid surface will do, at least a size that will hold a half sheet (40x60cms approx.)

■ Old paper scraps to try things on

- ****Paint:** There are so many different brands and the last thing you need is another 10 tubes. Bring what you have and if possible include a transparent Raw Sienna (I like W&N and one of the Art Spectrum Raw Sienna Hues is very clear).
