Tony Belobrajdic is a Sydney based figurative artist. He started exhibiting in the late seventies and had his first solo show in 1983 in Croatia. Tony moved to New York in 1987 where he continued his art practice. He exhibits both in Sydney and Europe regularly. Acrylics, watercolours and oils have been the mediums of choice.

His style could be described as contemporary impressionism, mostly portraits and figures. Tony's artwork demonstrates distinct freedom using spontaneous brushstrokes and vivid colours.

One water soluble graphite stick (black or sepia if you preferpicture attached). You can buy them in jars also, but they are more expensive and not necessary and we will need onetwo watercolour brushes.

There are several companies making water soluble graphite and I find Art Graf (readily available in Australia) of the best quality.

Watercolour paper, cold pressed would work very nice with graphite. Some ordinary cartridge paper for practicing.

### **MATERIAL LIST** FOR WATERCOLOUR

Very simple, bring what you have. Two watercolour brushes, rounded (not flat brushes used for oils and acrylics), large sizes are always the best, size 16 or 18.

Watercolour paints work better if you have them in pans, as a set. I buy them in tubes ( W&N, Schmincke or any brand really, recently painting a lot with Japanese Holbein paints) and than fill up the pans.

Old white china plate is best to mix colour, better than plastic mixing plates.

Paper, I use 300 grams, cold or hot pressed, sometimes rough (rough can be demanding specially if you are beginner with watercolours ). Arches or Saunders or Canson.

Most economical is to buy papers in large sheets and then cut them to half or 1/4 sheets. Paper in blocks is fine.

Canson Montval 300 or 200 grams, in block of 100, A3 size is very good and economical paper- excellent for practicing and painting.

Below is the picture of brushes I am using, but they are not compulsory. Soft rounded brushes large size.











## **RECENT WORKSHOPS - A GOOD ENDING TO THE YEAR**

We had 2 really good workshops to finish off our 2023 workshop program.

The first was Pauline Adair's "The Nude in Drawing & Watercolour" workshop. It was most disappointing that we had to reduce it to just one day. Difficulties in organising it had arisen by people saying they would be in it and then dropping out. Susan, our workshop coordinator, and Pauline had to decide whether or not to go ahead as numbers fluctuated between 5 and 9 up and down like a yo-yo! Pauline had travelled from the Gold Coast to tuition for us. Finally, 5 of us were there on the Sunday even though there were supposed to be 6. When you book your place in a workshop, please commit yourself to it. Thank you, Pauline, for still agreeing to come to tutor our workshop even though we had to reduce it to one day.

Those of us who participated gained great enjoyment and satisfaction from Pauline's excellent, professional tuition and the male model's challenging poses. This model had been our volunteer model on the 1st Saturday of November and, at short notice, stepped up for Pauline's workshop when the female model dropped out. Gaining committed models was another one of the headaches we had. We hope to have Pauline back for a workshop in 2024.

The other workshop was the watercolour workshop tutored by our president, Helen De Jonge who is quite an expert in watercolours and has tutored many of these for the GDAS. It was well attended and all of these participants had an enjoyable day and produced pleasing works under Helen's expert tuition. Thank you, Helen, for giving up your time to impart your knowledge and skills to these artists. Margaret Parry wrote: "Helen's recent watercolour workshop inspired me to continue. I thoroughly enjoyed doing the magpie and decided to have a go at some cows and I am very pleased with my endeavour."

You can invite such people to The Art Studio and to come to our Thursday Painting Days. By doing this you can be instrumental in increasing our membership.
